Your committee beg leave to report that in consideration of the fact that the exhibits did not accord with the premium list, several departures have been made therefrom; in most of these cases there were no competitive articles shown. For the purpose of proper recognition of meritorious art works otherwise unprovided for, we have taken the liberty to appropriate a number of these premiums, and we ask that you confirm our awards.

We would suggest that in future, the hanging committee be invested with discretionary power to reject, or temporarily withhold, any article apparently not possessing sufficient merit to warrant a display. Subsequent action of the committee on award may restore the article, or finally exclude it from the exhibition. By this means offensive displays might be avoided, and the personal feelings of the intending exhibitors be saved from the rude comments which naturally follow unmeritorious, or inapt exhibits.

We should take pleasure in being assured of the intention of your association, to establish a permanent art exposition in connection with the present enterprise, believing as we do that much would thereby be accomplished in the development and education of art taste in this community.

We think that you will agree with us in saying that there is already a wonderful interest taken in the subject, and that we are in advance of our immediate neighbors.
