

WANT THE STRIKE INVESTIGATED.

Chicago, April 30.—Anticipating that today's peace conference in Mayor Dunne's office would be futile, the Chicago federation of labor, without waiting for announcement of the result of the negotiations, appealed to President

Roosevelt and Gov. Deneen for assistance in the teamsters' strike. Fearing that troops may be sent to Chicago to preserve order during the strike, the labor organization has asked both the president and the governor to investigate the situation in Chicago before taking any such action. To facilitate the matter a committee was appointed with orders to communicate at once with both the president and the governor and visit Chicago May 8, but it is the intention of the labor body to get in communication with him immediately. A determined effort on the part of

Mayor Dunne and his peace committee, composed of Bishop C. P. Anderson of the Episcopal church, Rev. Jenkins Lloyd of St. Paul's church, Dr. Emil Hirsch of Sinai temple, Miss Jane Adams of Hull house, and Dr. Cornelius de Roy of Neighborhood house, to bring about an amicable settlement of the strike was an absolute failure at all peace negotiations, for the present at least, have been declared off. Indications tonight are that the strike sides seem determined in the stand they have taken. All members of the Employers' association will insist on all of their union teamsters making deliveries to the concerns already involved in the strike. A refusal on the part of any driver to

comply with this request, the employers declare, will be met with instant dismissal. The Teamsters' union has declared that in every instance where a union teamster is discharged for this reason every union driver employed by the firm making the dismissal will be ordered on strike. With both sides in this frame of mind there seems to be nothing which can prevent a rapid spread of the strike. The streets were free from rioting today as no effort was made to make deliveries to the firms involved. The employers spent the day in making preparations for the coming week, and it was stated tonight that hundreds of men had been secured since Saturday night, who will be put on the wagons tomorrow to take the places of the

strikers. The express companies had several wagons at work in transferring packages from one railroad to another. No interference on the part of the strike sympathizers was met with. Early today a mob of 500 men and boys, headed by a number of striking teamsters, raided the main stables of the Employers' Trading company, and stampeded the animals. William and Harry Grady, picture frame manufacturers, who were shot early today and seriously wounded, are said to have been the victims of a mob. Some time ago these men supplied Montgomery Ward & Co. with picture frames, but their contract expired several months ago. It is said by the police that strike sympathizers, who were of the belief that the Grady

were still connected with the Ward company, made the attack on the two men. Chartered to Carry Contraband. San Francisco, May 1.—The steamers Montana and the Australia have, it is said, been chartered at this port to carry contraband to Siberia. Both the Australia and the Montana are now in the harbor and will begin loading soon. Their exact destination is not given, and it is understood will be kept secret. A Russian agent, included among the passengers of the Montana will direct the captain where to go. It is said that the contraband will be landed far to the north of Vladivostok. In this way the



Russians hope to outwit the Japanese cruisers blocking Vladivostok.
