We shall think of the time when we thought we were the Saints of God; we shall think of our associations with this people, and these reflections will greatly increase our misery.

Are we not the framers of our own destiny? Are we not the arbitrators of our fate? This is another part of my text, and I argue from it, that it is our privilege to determine our own exaltation or degredation; it is our privilege to determine our own happiness or misery in the world to come. What is it that brings happiness now, that makes us so joyous in our assembling together? It is not wealth, for you may pour wealth, honor, influence and all the luxuries of this world into the lap of man, and destitute of the Spirit of God, he will not be happy, for that is the only source from which true happiness and comfort can come.

If I am doing right, I am preparing for thrones, principalities and dominions, resolved by the help of God that no man shall rob me of my crown. With this view of the subject, all the outward circumstances of this life do not trouble me.

I know it is the case that many men would like to have everything they can desire or thtnk of, and I used to think, if I were the Lord, I would give the people every thing they wanted-all the money, all the honor, all the riches and all the splendor their hearts could desire, but experience and observation have caused me to change my mind, for I know that such policy would not be good for the human family.

The Lord will try this people in all things that they may be prepared for ce'estial glory. Brethren and sisters, the time to bring our meeting to a close has come, I will, therefore, bring my remarks to a close, and pray God to bless you, in the name of Jesus Christ: Amen.
