Salt Lake Stake conference tomorrow.

SEQUEL TO DOWER INTEREST SUIT

Mrs. Annie F. A. Hilton Made Defendant in a Criminal Action.

ADULTERY IS THE CHARGE.

G. M. Owen Alleges that Defendant, Being the Wife of Dr. Park, Violated Seventh Commandment.

A complaint, sworn to by Charles Mostyn Owen, was filed with County Attorney Putnam this afternoon, charging Mrs. Annie F. A. Hilton, wife of Police Officer William Hilton, with the crime of adultery.

The proceedings are based on the complaint filed in the district court a couple of days ago by Mrs. Hilton, against Mrs. Rosa P. Roylance, to recover a dower interest in several acres of land deeded to the latter by the late Dr. John R. Park. In that complaint Mrs. Hilton alleged that she and Dr. Park were married in December, 1957, and that they continued to be husband and wife to the date of Dr. Park's death, which occurred last September. This statement was sworn to by Mrs. Hilton and was the direct cause of Mr. Owen's visit to the county attorney's office. To Mr. Putnam Owen related the fact that for many years Mrs. Hilton had been living with Police Officer Hilton, by whom she has a family of ten children. "If he be true," Owen is reported to have said, "this woman was the wife of Dr. Park when he died, and she has committed adultery and ought to be prosecuted for it."

It was suggested to the complainant that Mrs. Hilton may go upon the witness stand, and deny that she and Dr. Park were husband and wife at the time of the latter's death. Owen is said to have replied to that argument by saying: "Then she is guilty of perjury and could be successfully prosecuted on the charge were she to deny under oath her sworn statement made in the suit against Mrs. Roylance."

The complaint filed in Justice Neilson's court charges that the offense was committed on January 1st, 1959.

MR. JONES' VIEW.

N. V. Jones, Esq., is Mrs. Hilton's attorney, and said today in relation to the foregoing prosecution:

"This criminal action, instituted against Mrs. Hilton is evidently instigated by a spirit of revenge or retaliation, on account of my client's prosecuting her claims for property in the Park estate. The criminal suit following so closely the action of Mrs. Hilton in commencing her civil action in the Roylance case, justifies my conclusion, I can not believe that the State (which is the only beneficiary under the will) could or by through its officers, connivance or seek to become a beneficiary through such conduct. We shall simply treat the issues as they arise from time to time, and of the result I have no apprehension."
