DESERET EVENING NEWS.

WILL INVESTIGATE.

Government Geologist George E. Ellidge—Off For the Utah Indian Reservation.

The News last evening reproduced from the New York World a special Washington dispatch to that paper under date of the 14th inst, in the effect that Secretary Hayes Smith had despatched an expert government geologist to Utah to carefully inspect and report upon the 1902 Indians' claims and irrigation districts on the Uncompahgre and Uintah reservations. The purpose of the investigation is to secure data for the interior office, that will make impossible the numerous entanglements of Indians trying to secure possession of the districts.

Little of notice has been let about Secretary Hayes Smith arrived at that inspection to begin the preliminary examination of the Indians' claims and irrigation districts. The government geologist of Washington, D. C., and a member of the United States Geological Survey lecture, to which he gave yesterday afternoon at the University of Colorado, will also be present with the staff of the Colorado division of geology, presided over by Prof. S. F. Emmons.

CLAWSON'S BILL DISCUSSED.

Shall Wires be Banned Underground?

Frank Wallace, of the Telephone Co.,

Argues Against It.

The joint committee to which was referred Clawson's bill has this evening introduced a ordinance requiring the placing of all telephone, electric light and telegraph wires underground, and has been voting to discuss the question.

As far as the committee will be able to say, no action will be taken by the members of such an ordinance, were represented. The street railway companies were also represented, and they did not include the removal of their wires, only had nothing to say.

Engines Young, who is acting in conjunction with the committee, stated that he will call up the ordinators and that it will be done to that end in the city of Buffalo.

President Wallace, of the Telephone company, expressed the opinion that if the proposed ordinance was passed, those who passed it would live to regret it.

Mr. Hayes, of the Telephone company, thought the street railway companies should be included, as he considered the wires of those companies a greater danger than all the others combined. Again, he said, no action will be taken, as it will be necessary to place their wires underground when their franchises granted them the right to string them overhead.

Manager Hayward, of the Electric Light company, said that they were a company that had been in business for a long time, and that he did not consider the committee that the matter of operating wires underground, was as yet an experiment, and advised the committee not to act hastily in the matter.

Patent attorney, who was bad, as the other interests were laboring under a disadvantage in not having a copy of the proposed ordinance, the master was bad over him a week. In the meantime copies of it will be furnished to all concerned, so that the most regenerate among us need not be afraid of its merits or demerits at the committee's next meeting.

J. W. Farrel, of the Electric Light company, said that they were in favor of the proposed ordinance, but that it was being considered last night by the special committee to whom it was referred. They will likely have a report in hand at tonight's session of the City Council.
