WANT OF MORAL PRINCIPLE AMONG MEN IN POSITIONS OF TRUST AND

A Sermon by Rev. J. H. Bayliss, a Roberts' Park Chapel, Indianapolis Ind., Sabbath Evening, Jan. 14.

[CONTINUED.] PROVERBS XVI. 12: "It is an abomina-tion to kings to commit wickedness: for the throne is established by righteous-

To this day my ears are soluted every morning with a jangled chorus in which I catch an occasional phrase like these "patched vouchers;" "cat skinning;" "the State robbed of thousands of dollars," "altered figures;" I do not know what it all means. I am a stranger, and am not read up in the local meaning of the cabalistic words. What individuals or parties are referred to I know not; I do not desire to know; I hope mobody will tell me. I do not want to be hindered in my individual or party relations from speaking plain truth. I desire, without fear or favor, to wield a keen blade. I should desire to strike for the truth, If my foe were my brother; but I would rather not know it to be my brother. Not knowing him I should probably whet my sword to a keener edge, and nerve my arm for a deeper cut. But while I do not understand all the meaning of all these current expressions, I do see that they mean wrong in public

But while I do not understand all the meaning of all these current expressions, I do see that they mean wrong in public life; abused confidence; appropriations of public money for private use; the sentries placed to guard the public interest have themselves preyed upon it; the smoke of public corruption that fills the air everywhere in America, as it appears, hangs heavy over us. You see, therefore, that I do not speak as a politician. The great defrauders of the hour all happen to belong to one party, but nobody dreams that that unfortunate party has a monopoly of dishonest office-holders. The thing I speak of is not political at all. It is what multitudes among us run into as soon as they have the opportunity, without any reference to the political machinery by which the opportunity is given them. The oportunity is the great thing; the party is nothing, or nearly so.

Still more; I would not say that all officials are thus deficient at the vital point of moral principle. I am not prepared even to accept all that is boldly charged by the papers. I can not believe it. Some men can b found in office whose moral characters are above impeachment, or even a valid criticism;

office whose moral characters are above impeachment, or even a valid criticism; men of integrity; men who can not be bought, nor frightened, nor flattered in-to the slightest departure from what they think to be rigid honesty. All I assert is, that this thing has become so common as to stand out in the form of a great ugly fact; it is manifest to us; it is observed by other nations, and is commented on in a way to affect our national reputation. It has almost assumed the dignity (?) of a national characteristic. It is a fact so notorious, so prodigious, so abominable in itself, and strikes a blow at once so direct and powerful at our national presperity, that even the man who most dreads the charge of creaking can not excuse himself from speaking his condemnation.

Foreign stockholders in the Eric railway have been so defrauded by adroit men who knew how to manage and buy up courts of justice—or rather of injustice—that our whole system of elective judiciary is denounced in no measured terms. They are outraged and mad to see men reveiling in stolen splender at their expense, and protected in their infamy by so-called courts of law; and our whole judicial system is disgraced thereby, and one who has any regard for the standing of his country among foreign nations is moved to speak his abhorrence of practices which have brought his country into diagrace.

I have no disposition to compare the present with the past—if is a matter of little consequence; nor have I anything to do with the question whether we have more or laws without the forms of government. I am dealing with a monstrous fact as it really exists among us. Of its existence, there is and can be no question. We are being robbed, wear by year, of millions up-

is and can be no question. We are being robbed, year by year, of millions upon millions of dollars. Suspicions are on millions of dollars. Suspicions are entertained concerning any number of public men, which would eject them at once from any position of trust in a private business; they are charged with corruption in the public prints; in some cases their names are called, and the charge is personal; but they smile serenely, whistletheir indifference, continue their depredations and hold on to their positions.

Now the question arises, what is the philosophy of this state of things? Why is it that every little while somebody who has stood high in the estimation of his employers turns out to be a defaulter? Why do so many public officials do the same thing? Why—nais commonly believed—are so many of our legislatures open to corruption? Why do our judges, so many of them, accept bribes? Why do men who are in sufficient prominence to do it dare to bring upon themselves the concentrated maledictions of the civilized world by frauds so stupendous as to be almost beyond belief? Why is it that the word "swindle" has become a stock phrase in almost every newspaper throughout the land, in talking of the administration of public affairs?

The philosophy of this state of things is to be found, very largely, in and about this fact that the only aristocracy we have in this country is the aristocracy we have in this country is the aristocracy of money.

We have very high appreciation of the aristocracy of blood, as is proved by the ready delight with which we dance attendance upon every specimen of it which comes among us; but the aristocracy of blood we do not possess. In the realm of mind we have an idol, but it is "general intelligence," not the royalty of genius, though we have a good opinion of that. The aristocracy of money we have, and it only needs to be stated to gain universal assent, that no other social power in this country compares for the moment with this. It is the sure passport, to society. There are tens of thousands of people among us in the highest social relations who, in their poverty at the cutset, had no dream of social elevation; they are now where they are simply through the accident of wealth. They were just as intelligent in their days of poverty as they are now; just as high principled; had then every essential element of character which they possess now; but nobody in high life thought of them until they blossomed out into a luxurious style of living. As soon as thee began to glisten they were recognized. They deserved recognition always, but they could not get it until they had money enough to command it.
