That Highway Robbery.—The

Lee Brothers, charged with at-

tempted highway robbery upon Mr.

Austin and of beating and bruising

Messrs. Hennefer and son, a week

ago last Saturday night, on South

Temple Street, were brought before

Justice Spiers to-day, for examina-

tion. E. L. Lee, the elder and

shorter of the two, the one shot in

the head by young Hennefer, was

waived an examination, and the

proceedings were therefore to show

the guilt of the other accused, J. S.

Lee. The witnesses for the prose-

cution were Mr. Austin, the Hen-

nefers, Captain Burt, and officers

Phillips, Hampton, and Burt. The

testimony did not show any new

facts of importance connected with

the affair, further than has al-

ready been published.

After the close of the evidence

for the prosecution, E. L. Lee made

a statement, in which he confessed

his own guilt, but endeavored to

exculpate his brother, who, he de-

clared, was not a participant in the

robbery, it being, he said, two other

parties who were engaged in it

with him. He said himself and

companions tried the lower part of

town the same night, without suc-

cess, and then went to South Tem-

ple street. He stated that Mr.

Austin was the second man they

attacked. The first one was under

the influence of liquor and, when

asked for money, said he had noth-

ing of precedence, Holman and

other decided that the

organization of the House was

necessarily the first business in or-

der, while Banks and other repub-

licans contended that all the mem-

bers had a right to participate in

the election.

Frye claimed the same right for

the colleague elected in the place

of Blair. Finally, the clerk de-

clared that the resolution offered by

Holman took the precedence; from

that decision an appeal was taken

by Banks, which appeal Cox mov-

ed to lay on the table, agreed to.

Holman's resolution then came

up for action, and was adopted

without opposition. It was as fol-

lows: "The House being informed

that, since its last adjournment,

M. C. Kerr, who, at the commence-

ment of the present Congress was

elected Speaker of the House, de-

parted this life, creating a vacancy

in the office of Speaker, it is, there-

fore, ordered that the House do now

proceed to the election of a Speaker

pro tempore."

Samuel J. Randall was nomi-

nated by Cox, and James A. Garfield

by McCreary, Clymer, Banning,

Banks, of Mass., and Wilson, of

Iowa, were appointed tellers. The

vote resulted as follows: The whole

number of votes cast were 246, ne-

cessary to a choice 123. Samuel J.

Randall received 101, James A.

Garfield, 83, Wm. C. Williams, of

Wisconsin, 1, given by his col-

league, Magoon, Wm. R. Morrison

1, given by Potter, of Michigan,

Geo. F. Hoar 1, given by Seelye, of

Mass. The announcement of the

result was greeted with applause in

the galleries.

Cox and McCreary conducted

Speaker Randall to his chair, when

he read his speech from manuscript.
