STRAIGHTENING OUT **KLEYBOLTE & CO.'S AFFAIRS**

New York, Jan. 14.-Charles A. Dicknson of the Carnegie Trust company; Andrew Sullivan, president of the Real Estate Trust company and Newman Erb, who at the height of the financial depression took over the affairs o Rudolph Kleybolte & Co., of No. 113 Broadway, in the interest of creditors, whose claims approximated nearly whose claims approximated nearly \$8,000,000, met yesterday in the Car-negle Trust company's office and for-mally voted to return to the company control of its property, says the Her-ald this morning. The great increase in the value of securities since the committee was formed wiped out the excess of itabilities over assets and made possible this action.
