It would be impossible to enumerate the stores exhibiting, for they are of every kind, from the leading houses to a grocery, hardware and mill and feed, candle and soap, drug, grocery, flour, bacon, butter, lard, and many others, willing to make the mouth of the customer water with anticipation and delight.

Dry goods houses vie with one another in making their displays winter-representative with rich and beautiful goods, garments of domestic style, and line of great variety, with silks, roses, hose, etc., to suggest ever presenting itself to what manufacturing genius could really do.

The display of clothing for men is every day becoming more ornate and elaborate, as the tailors and dressers, the upholsterers and manufacturers of every house and establishment are working hard and well to meet the wants of the public. The man who has a family to support, however, is almost as bewitching as is that of the ladies.

Not satisfied with the glory of plush, diamonds, and emeralds, many of the interests of the leading stores are interests of women. Mrs. A. M. Allen, Mrs. Z. C. L. L. are illustrations.
