John Carter, an old resident
of Green creek, Oregon, was killed on
Sunday while out hunting, by his
nephew, Francis Edmunds, a
young man, 21 years old. The
two brothers were hunting separated,
and later Edmunds saw emerge from
thicket what he believed to be a deer.
Quickly dropping his rifle he
drew his revolver and shot him.
Edmunds was shot in the shoulder, Carter
in the head entered Carter's neck,
and ringing down, came out through
the ear, killing him instantly.
Nothing is known further than Edmunds
was shot in the shoulder, and that the killing
was purely accidental. The dead
man, about three years ago, married a
woman of Edmunds, but soon left her,
and recalled that she was wholly devoted
to him, and later they were divorced.

Francis Bachelder, a wealthy
man, married merchant and capitalist,
died at Salt Lake City, after a pro-
longed illness. He had been slowly
dying for a long while. Toward the
end his respiration was assisted by the
artificial respiration. The treatment
was successful, but the disease continued.
It is estimated that the cost was in the
neighborhood of \$300 a day. The de-
ceased had been a resident of Salt Lake
for nearly ten years past. His estate is
estimated to be worth over \$1,000,-
000. He died in relative poverty.
He was 50 years of age, but the
lately was active, and personally handled
all the details of his affairs. His last illness began to grow
worse two days ago. He contracted
malaria, and pneumonia, and pulmonary
tuberculosis. For a week oxygen was
constantly administered to him. More
than 2,000 gallons were used in keeping
the respiratory organs in motion.
A few hours before he died he was
seen with oxygen, and succumbed
Sunday morning. Dr. Mutter, the
attending physician, said the quantity of
gas administered was very unusual.
The gas used cost \$500.

A short time ago the news related
that a man had been found dead in
Los Angeles, Cal., had been a citizen of that
place in his efforts to get his freedom
by going to law and refusing to arise
for the officer to take him to the city
hall. It is now stated that on Saturday
Mr. Koch was brought to the police
