

## ITS EFFECTS ON THE PHYSICAL AND MORAL NATURE.

At Address Delivered at the General Conference of the Church, in the  
Tabernacle, Salt Lake City, Saturday, April  
6th, 1890. by

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It is a question, then, of what appears to be about the importance of the subject that Frankford George, Jr. has just announced. 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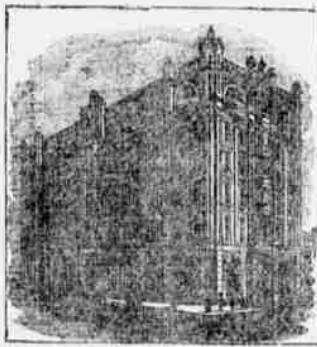
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
