NEW YORK.

Election.

NEW YORK, 12.—The latest returns indicate that the Assembly will be a tie. This is on the supposition that a Republican is elected in Fulton and Hamilton, as that district is still doubtful. If a Democrat is elected, then the Democrats have a majority of two; otherwise, it is a tie.

NEW YORK, 12, LONDON, 12.—Rumors are rife of a rupture between Bismarck and Von Beust.

ILLINOIS.

French Minister to Washington—About Secretary Cox.

CHICAGO.—The Tribune's special says the credentials of the French minister, appointed by the National Government to succeed Provost Parodi, are here awaiting the arrival from Chile of the minister expected by the next steamer from Panama. Mr. Berthold is still without communications from the new government.

Mr. Parahd, of Texas, one of McGarrahan's counsel, who was shut out of the interior department by Secretary Cox for writing insulting communications to its officers, prints a card this evening, evidently by way of retaliation. The following is a specimen: "I say unqualifiedly of myself, and I am sure I can for Shaw, and every other attorney engaged for McGarrahan, that if any such letter was ever shown to Cox, or any body else, it was a wholesale forgery, and I believe the statement to have been a mere invention. As to the claim itself, Cox makes not one statement about it which is not grossly false or largely exaggerated."

It has been decided not to make public the sentences in the cases of the defaulting paymasters, until they have all been disposed of.

WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, 12.—It is reported that the Chief Justice of the U. S. Court of Claims, a life position, recently resigned by Judge Casey, will be tendered to Senator Williams of Oregon.

The Cabinet remained in session an unusual time yesterday, and everybody concluded the impending bureau changes and appointments were the subjects of discussion. It transpired, however, that nothing of the sort was considered, other questions monopolizing the meeting.

OHIO.

Suspension.

CINCINNATI, 12.—David Gibson & Co., extensive liquor dealers of this city, suspended yesterday. Their liabilities are \$600,000, including their secured papers. The firm claim it is not a failure, but a suspension, from which they will recover shortly.

FOREIGN NEWS.

PRUSSIA.

Violation of International Law.

BERLIN, 12.—Queen Augusta received the following from King William yesterday afternoon, dated Versailles, 11th: "General Von der Taun yesterday retired from Orleans to Tourny, before a superior force of the enemy." He fought the French, however, all the way. He has already been reinforced by General Whittich and Prince Albrecht. The latter came up from Chartres. The Duke of Mecklenburg-Schwerin will also join his forces to those of Von der Taun today."

The North German Gazette, referring to the sinking of the German bark Charlotte, by the French man-of-war De Sais, says it was a flagrant violation of international law, and action on the matter will be taken by the Prussians at the proper time.

Despatches received here to-day from the German headquarters at Versailles, announce that Paris will not be bombarded. The German authorities are convinced that the city is so fully provided that its surrender may be expected within a month from that cause alone.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Alabama claims—Treaty of '56 to be revised—War material taken at Orleans—Bombardment to be renewed.

LONDON, 12.—Bismarck has issued a circular to the representatives of North Germany in foreign states, giving his version of late negotiations for an armistice. The appointment of such a man as Thiers by the French, to conduct negotiations, a man of such wide experience, had excited hope of propositions that might be successful. King William was even more eager for peace than Thiers. Bismarck proposed a truce for four weeks; the position of the respective armies meanwhile to be fixed in order that the election might be held throughout France. The only effect on the French side, of this truce, would have been the stoppage of a waste of
