SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 18.—Davis, from

the committee on judiciary, reported

with amendments, the Senate

to provide for the distribution of

awards made under the convention

between the United States and Mexico

of 1847. Placed on the calendar.

Garland called up the Senate bill

supplementary to the act of March

3d, 1874, in relation to the Hot

Springs, Rose-van-in, Arkansas, and

it was passed. The bill authorizes

the President to appoint three com-

missioners to hold the office for

one year, to have the same powers

as the commissioners authorized by

the act of March 3d, 1877, to deter-

mine claims made under the act,

which is continued in force.

Gordon moved to postpone pending

and all prior orders and take up

the House bill for the introduction

of contagious or infectious

disease in the United States. Agreed

to and the bill passed.

The Senate resumed consideration

of the bills on the calendar.

The following were disposed of:

The Senate bill authorizing the

citizens of Colorado, Nevada and

territories to sell and remove timber

on the public domain for mining

and domestic purposes, passed.

The Senate bill reported from the

railroad committee, which still

remained on the calendar; indefinitely

postponed. The Senate bill
