LOCAL BRIEFS.

Third Class Formed—Another Eight A class was organized yesterday in the Lafayette school, making three A classes, indicating that the mid-year graduating class will be the largest in local school history.

Good Fruit Field—Secretary Taylor of the state board of horticulture has just returned from a trip to Washington county, where he reports the fruit yield as exceptionally good. In fact can be surpassed anywhere.

Balance From Legislature—H. S. Cummings, chief deputy of the secretary of state, returned to the state treasurer yesterday a voucher for \$4,416.97 of the unexpended portion of the \$25,000 appropriated for the expense of the legislature.

Big Coal Land Buy—Nearly \$14,000 was paid into the local land office yesterday afternoon for 317 acres of coal land in Carbon county. George W. Higgins of Clinton, Iowa, paid \$8,000 for 160 acres and James A. Williams paid \$7,839 for 157 acres.

Fibs On Water For Power—Milton S. Hamilton of Oakland, California, has filed application with the state engineer for 108 1/2 acre feet of water from his Cottonwood creek to furnish 2,500 horse power from six 60-inch water wheels, the water to be returned to the creek after using for power purposes.

Epileptics sent to Provo—The insanity board of the state mental hospital met yesterday in Governor Furr's office. Several patients were examined who will be sent to the hospital under the new law passed by the legislature setting apart a building for the non-insane epileptics. This is the first session of the board held for this purpose.

Wilson Has Typhoid—Devereaux Wilson, stenographer in the criminal division of the city court, is confined at the Holy Cross hospital suffering from typhoid fever. Mr. Wilson had been confined at his home a few days, attempting to resume his duties Saturday, but was compelled to return home before the day was done. Yesterday his condition pronounced his case as that of typhoid and ordered his removal to the hospital. His condition was reported this afternoon as entirely satisfactory.

Valuable As A Curio—C. B. Wadell of Winona, Minn., has written Secretary Perkins of the Salt Lake Real Estate association for information as to the existence of stock of the Seneca Falls Silver Mining company of Utah. Secretary Perkins could not get any trace of such stock in the office of the secretary of state, but from the county clerk he discovered that the charter of the company was dated 1872, and is a life of only 20 years. So the stock, if any exists, is worth only its value as a curio.

Alpine M. I. A.—James H. Anderson, who attended the M. I. A. convention of Alpine state at Pleasant Grove yesterday, in company with Augusta W. Grant, of the Young Ladies board, reports large attendance of young people from all over the state. The exercises provided for the occasion were excellent, and the organizations of the state were shown to be in good shape for the work of the coming season. During the convention the work to be done was outlined and the studies of the manual were taken up and discussed.

Reagan Loses Foot—Charles H. Reagan, proprietor of the Reagan bar and residing at 215 south Third East street, suffered the amputation of his right foot this morning as the result of a street car accident last night. While attempting to board the front platform of a moving South Temple street car at the corner of Second and South Main streets, Mr. Reagan misjudged his grasp of the handle railing, and fell in such a way that his right foot went under the wheels. He was carried to the hospital store and then removed to the Holy Cross hospital. His foot was so badly crushed that amputation was necessary, and the operation was performed this forenoon.
