Stranger Dies in Wine Room—Death of Mrs. John A. Long Mrs. Sherwood and G. W. Higley.

Ogden, Utah, Sept. 25.—George Jefferson, a stranger in Ogden, died very unexpectedly Saturday evening in a wine room at the rear of the St. Louis beer hall from valvular heart trouble, superinduced by the high altitude.

He is a man about 32 years of age and has the appearance of being of Indian descent. He arrived in Ogden Saturday from Huntington, Or., enroute according to the railroad ticket found in his possession to Green Bay, Wisconsin. He had only stopped over between trains and with a friend went up town, when near the beer hall he was suddenly taken with a spell and his friend rushed him into the wine room and laid him down. There he lay for half an hour and anyone could get to his side he expired, and the man who was with him suddenly disappeared. This aroused suspicion and the police were called and Dr. Dickson, who carefully examined the man, they found in his pockets a large amount of money, which he had apparently lost, also an electric oil water heater, which had been ticketed to Green Bay, a baggage check and several small articles. He was well dressed and of excellent appearance. The remains were removed to Larkin &amp; Son's undertaking parlors where Drs. Dickson and Whiting and Prof. F. C. Johnson of Denver, performed an autopsy on the deceased, after he had met with any foul play. They found the valves of his heart enlarged and his stomach showed signs of his having been drinking considerably, but there were no evidences of poison, neither did the body show any bruises, hence the doctors concluded he died from heart weakness. His remains are embalmed and will be held at the morgue in an endeavor to locate his people.

DEATH OF GEO. W. HIGLEY.

Veteran of 74 Succumbs to Runaway Accident of a Week Ago.

At the result of serious injury sustained a week Sunday, George W. Higley, one of the best known and earliest settlers of the county, died from mortalities at his home 152 Poplar avenue, Saturday night at 11 o'clock, at the ripe age of 76 years.

Mr. Higley was out driving a week ago yesterday when his team started running away but had only gone a short distance when he struck a tree, which he was riding, cutting a piece of bone from his head causing concussion of the brain. He was picked up and taken to his home, but never regained consciousness, although everything that living hands and medical skill could do was done.

He was born in Connecticut, Nov. 20, 1833. When a young man he joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and came to Weber county 1850 and has resided ever since at Hooper and Ogden, where he has made many friends. He leaves a wife, 12 grown sons and daughters, 32 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren to revere his name. The funeral services will be held Tuesday morning at 10:30 o'clock at his late home. His remains will be taken to Hooper where services will be held at the meetinghouse commencing at 12 o'clock. Interment will take place at Hooper.

SUDDEN DEATH OF MRS. LONG

A sad and sudden death occurred on Aug. 25, 1905, when the spirit of Mrs. Josephine Combe Long, almost without warning, left her body.
