A little before 8 p. m., of the same day, with 8 or 9 miles speed, and a smooth sea, the steamer ran on a rock south of Maule, about 18 miles.

The whole number saved was 43 out of all on board; so that 315 persons perished .- [Valparaiso Echo, Feb. 15, 1856.




