

**SHIPWRECK.**—On the 30th of January at 11 a.m., the Chilean war steamer Cazador left Talcahuano for Valparaiso, having on board 358 persons. These consisted of 86 soldiers of the second battalion of the line, 4 officers of the same, 148 women, 40 children, 14 passengers, and the steamer's crew numbering 66 persons.

A little before 8 p. m., of the same day, with 8 or 9 miles speed, and a smooth sea, the steamer ran on a rock south of Maule, about 18 miles. The whole number saved was 43 out of all on board; so that 315 persons perished.—[Valparaiso Echo, Feb. 15, 1856.]
