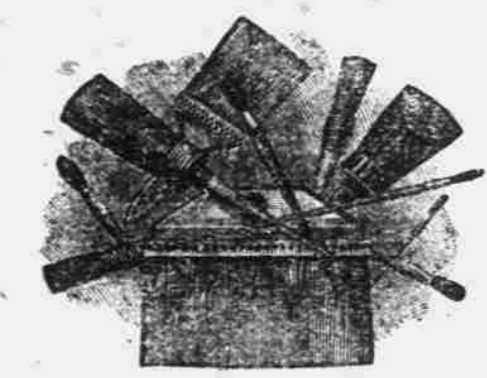

WASHINGTON, June 13.—Secretary Lamar returned from the south this morning and was at his desk in the Interior Department. On account of the illness of a member of her family Mrs. Lamar will extend her visit indefinitely.

FIFTY CHASSEPOTS muskets and accoutrements, which were presented by the government of France to the Mutual Aid Society of New Orleans.
