Regular and Natural Increase of Business Over That of Last Year.

UNION SCALE LIKELY TO RAISE

Some Uncertainty Among Contractors Owing to the Uncertainty of the Future Wage Schedules.

The local business situation continues to show cause for strong anticipations as to brisk conditions, unless labor complications arise, particularly in the matter of further advances in prices of labor and material.

REAL ESTATE MARKET.

The real estate market has been fair and on the whole satisfactory, with reasonable anticipations of a good year.

LABOR UNION BOGEY.

But while really men and contractors agree that the necessities of the town demand new houses, there is apprehension that the labor unions may so raise their rates as to seriously hamper the building movement.

INCREASE IN MATERIAL.

In certain lines of material, there is prospect of increased cost, as with lumber; but a prominent brick man told the writer yesterday that the brick situation was easy now, so that common brick can be had on call, while facing brick can be delivered within 30 days from time of ordering.

CLOTHING DEMAND.

The clothing trade reports better business than last week, though for the last day or two, the sudden chilling of the weather has reduced sales.

SHOES PROSPEROUS.

The shoe trade reports a very prosperous week, the retail spring trade opening up in satisfactory shape, but with prices still as possible.

BANK CLEARINGS.

New York, March 22.—Bradstreet's bank clearings report for the week ending March 21, shows an aggregate of \$385,171,000, as against \$2,282,200,000 last week and \$2,726,625,000 in the corresponding week last year.
