SCHOOL BOARD MATTERS.

More Principals Employed and Addi-
tional Teachers Named.

*Utah University Candidates Find
Employment—Change of Junitors
—Inaugural Report.*

The board of Education holds a trial
of many cases involving all of the
members to present except Thomas
and Westfield. Dismissal was
as follows:

A number of applicants for positions
as janitors and various domestics
were received and called for.

A communication was received from
the committee expressing regret over
the non-employment for the coming
school year of Prof. Edington who
is principal at the present school.

The resignation of Mrs. Ada Mc-
Graw as teacher for the school year
beginning September next was re-
ceived. The following report was
adopted:

Your committee on teachers and
school work beg to recommend the
employment of the following teachers
at the school year beginning July 1, 1895, at the salary set opposite their
respective names:

W. V. Finkler, principalship of
the Bryant school at \$100 per month.

H. G. Bradford, vice principalship of
the Utica school at \$87 per month.

We recommend that Mrs. Ida H.
Worthen be transferred from the
Deerwood school to the principalship
of the Twelfth school at a salary of \$125
per month, same as Mrs. F. H.
Knight, resigned.
