LONDON, 15. — A correspondent telegraphs as follows from Bucha-rest, Friday night: I left the battle field before Plevna at noon yester-day. Two redoubts were taken by Skobeloff in Tuesday svening and were held twenty-four hours. On Wedneeday the Turks made six at-tacks and finally, about six in the evening, drove him out. He lost three cannon which he had placed in the redoubt. He asked for rein-forcements several times, but Gen. Levitsky refused them, thinking Gen. Skobeloff had enough men to hold the redoubt. Kirloff, on his own responsibility, sent the remnant of a regiment which had attacked the arrived too late, and another regiment ment sent from headquarters of staff to reinforce him arrived when Gen. Skobeloff already had retreat-ed. The loss of these re-doubts is disastrous for the Russiane, as it seems that the Ru-isans in possession of these two redoubts and the Grivica redoubt had counted upon recommencing CALOON, the offensive immediately. This is now impossible antil the arrival of reinforcements. When I left the battle all was quiet except a light artillery fire. The Russians were still in possession of Grivica re-doubt, which was under a continual heavy fire from the Turks. This redoubt was visited by Col. Wellealy who says, it is heaped full of dead Russians and Roumanians.

A dispatch from Shumla says Orman Pasha has attacked the Russians in great force at Dubnit on the road from Plevna to Sophia where they had fortified them-selves. The Russians were badly beaten, and have lost several thou-sand men, besides nine guns.
