EUROPEAN.

PARIS, 28.—The Mayors of several

of the communes of France

have refused to placard the speech of

Dufaure, minister of justice, delivered

in the National Assembly during the

debate two weeks ago, on the petition

for the dissolution of that body. Du-

faure, in his remarks, spoke ironically

of Gambetta, whose speeches, he said,

were caused by needless agitation

throughout the country, and the As-

sembly, by a resolution, directed the

placement of the speech. It is probable

that the actions of the Mayors will lead

to an interpellation of the government

upon the meeting of the Assembly after

the holidays.

BRUSSELS.—The North German

Gazette denies the statement that Ger-

many has consented to co-operate with

Austria and Russia in the effort to effect

a settlement of the Louisiana silver

dispute. The Gazette also stigmatizes

the allocation of the Pope, delivered at

the consistory held in Rome on the

23rd instant, as an unpardonable insult

to the Emperor of Germany, and a col-

ossal impudence. The Pope, says the

Gazette, proves the inevitable necessity

for the immediate passage of a law de-

fining the boundaries between the

state and the Roman Catholic church.

France and Belgium, near the line

separating these two countries.

ward Bannerman Ramsey, Dean of St.
