

## SERVANT HAS BECOME MASTER

Jerome Says Party Machinery is Used to Deprive People of Political Rights.

## HEARST IS AGAINST MURPHY.

Also Against the McCarrans, Sullivans, McJellans and Belmonts and Their Jeromes.

New York, Aug. 21.—Charles F. Murphy, leader of Tammany Hall, today said he had not observed any sentiment in Tammany for the nomination of Dist. Atty. William Travers Jerome as governor by the Democratic state convention, but there was, he said, plenty of sentiment for W. R. Hearst. Mr. Murphy declared that he was not committed to any candidate, but it was the sentiment of the organization, and he would be guided by it at the state convention. Mr. Murphy said that Tammany delegates to the convention would be bound by the unit rule.

Atty. Jerome tonight gave out the following statement: "It is no surprise to me to find Murphy practically declaring for Hearst. The only reason for my taking an active part in politics this year is to carry out the fight of last year, which was a fight to free the people and parties from the domination of just such political pan-handlers.

"Birds of a feather flock together," and when a person intellectually superior, socially vulgar and morally obtuse insults the decent people of the state, irrespective of party, by seeking the nomination of a political party by advancing dollars and not ideas, and by methods akin to those of the black-mailer, no thinking man could doubt where Murphy stood.

"I should fear I had lost all my ideals if I found men of this type supporting me, except under absolute compulsion.

"If I ever come to have any influence in the Democratic party it will be used to drive out bosses of this type.

"Both the Democratic and Republican parties have long enough been disgraced and dominated by men of this type, controlling party organization.

"Party organization was created originally to render effective the will of the people.

"The servant has become the master, and the executive machinery, controlled by small groups of selfish and unusually corrupt men, has been used to deprive the people of the parties of their political freedom.

"The fight is not to destroy parties. Parties are essential to the proper working of our political institutions. The fight is to free the parties from just such men as Murphy, to deprive them of their control of their executive machinery, to restore to it the discharge of the functions for which it was created, the effective expression of the will of the people who compose the party. When this is done we shall have leaders and not bosses. We shall have inventions of real delegates seeking to determine whom the people want placed in nomination. We shall have candidates and public officers in which the people's voice has been potent and who will feel that their responsibility is to the people and not to some political boss who created them."

William R. Hearst tonight gave out the following statement: "I have no interest whatever in the factional disputes of Tammany Hall. These declarations for or against me are nothing more than at most to influence votes in primary contests.

"Over three months ago I gave an interview to the Brooklyn Eagle defining my position, which I have not altered. I repeat now that I am absolutely and unalterably opposed to the Murphys and the McCarrans, and also to the Sullivans and the McJellans, and the kind of policies they all represent.

"I am opposed to boss rule in politics.

"I am opposed to corporation control of parties through machines and the fact that a boss or a machine declares for me does not alter my attitude in any particular.

"I am also opposed to the Ryans and Benetis and their Jeromes in politics, to the corrupt use of wealth to debauch the ballot and to the purchase of puppets in offices.

"I am opposed to these paid puppets in office who serve their corporation masters slavishly and shamelessly through their whole term of office and only develop a semi-sense of decency and a pretended regard for the people when an election is pending.

"The country needs a purifying independent movement, because the old parties are infected with the vermin of bosses, corruptionists and rascals in office who mouth empty words about civic corporation masters are juggling in their pockets."

"Mr. Roosevelt says the people need a square deal. I would add that to have a square deal they must have a new deal, for nearly all the cards in the political packs are marked by the corporations and dirty and do-sored from the corrupt uses to which they have been put."

## CHICAGO'S COLORED FOUR HUNDRED.

Chicago, Aug. 22.—Chicago's colored population has its "400." Its members are listed in the "Colored People's Blue-book of Chicago," just published.

The book contains 50 pages of advertisement of business concerns run by colored people, a classified directory and professional directory and names of 80 prominent colored persons, selected according to social standing.

According to this directory, Chicago's colored population has 35 churches, 35 lawyers, four newspapers, 40 physical clubs, 14 literary clubs, 10 social clubs and 25 women's clubs.

## GIFT TO BERKELEY.

University Accepts \$100,000 from Mrs. Mackay for a Professorship.

Berkeley, Cal., Aug. 21.—At a meeting of the regents of the University of California today formal acceptance was made of the gift of a hundred thousand dollars made to the university by Mrs. Jno. Mackay and her son, Clarence Mackay, for the endowment of a professorship of electrical engineering and the support of research work along electrical engineering lines. Prof. Clarence L. Cory was elected the first incumbent of the Jno. W. Mackay, Jr., chair of electrical engineering.

## A SUCCESSFUL DUEL.

Two Men in Indian Territory Fight One and Kill Each Other.

Muskogee, I. T., Aug. 21.—Near Dustin, I. T., 25 miles southwest of Muskogee, Jas. Hayes and George Brown fought a duel with revolvers. Brown was killed outright and Hayes died shortly afterward. Hayes was a prominent Indian citizen and a member of the Creek council. The cause of the trouble is unknown.

## MURDERED BY A NEGRO.

Tallade, Ala., Aug. 21.—In a difficulty at the Plinters chemical plant, J. P. Howell, assistant superintendent, was shot through the heart and killed by Jim Sims, a negro, and P. T. Crown, superintendent, was shot through the thigh. The trouble was caused by an impudent message the negro had sent the superintendent. The negro escaped.

## WAS AN ODESSA MUTINEER.

Helsingfors, Aug. 22.—Platin, one of the agitators captured at Sveaborg fortress at the time of the suppression of the recent mutiny there, turns out to have been involved in the mutiny at Odessa of the crew of the battleship Kniaz Potemkin in May, 1905, for which he was exiled to Siberia for 15 years, but escaped from that country.

## COLOMBIAN AFFAIRS.

New York, Aug. 22.—A cable dispatch to the Herald from Bogota, Colombia, says:

Jno. Barrett, United States minister to Colombia, has left here for Guayaquil for a conference with Secretary Root on the proposed treaty with the United States concerning Panama.

The cabinet has declared Senor Mendosa, former minister to the United States, a traitor for revealing diplomatic secrets. The country approves of calling Mendosa to judgment.

The government has received a proposition from a French syndicate for opening the mouth of the Magdalena river.

English capitalists offer to open Cartagena harbor. Both projects are favorably considered.

## MAIL CLERK ARRESTED.

New York, Aug. 22.—Henry W. Swandt, 24 years of age, a distributing clerk in the parcel department at the general postoffice, was arrested last night on a charge of embezzlement from the mails. A search of Swandt's rooms, the police say, resulted in the discovery of stolen property estimated to be worth \$5,000, which included watches, jewelry, etc.

New York, Aug. 22.—The Herald today says:

J. Q. A. Ward, dean of the American sculptors and for more than half a century a leader in art, was showered yesterday with congratulations on his recent marriage. The noted sculptor has just passed the seventy-sixth milestone in life's journey and has been married twice before.

Announcement also was made by Mr. Ward that he would soon retire from the practice of his profession and devote his remaining years to peace and quietness.

Mr. Ward declined to gratify the curiosity of earnest inquirers as to the identity of the bride. "Why should you ask?" he interrogated. "Does the public care? I am no kaiser or president. Certainly it is not necessary that I should tell the name of the lady. That is a personal matter. It concerns only my own happiness. I have no children and no other ties. Douglass has consented to again provide there was no contest, said that if the party could agree upon Mr. Douglass for governor, he would gladly withdraw from the contest.

became the wife of the Prince of Monaco. The princess is half American by birth and is also related to the great poet Heine.

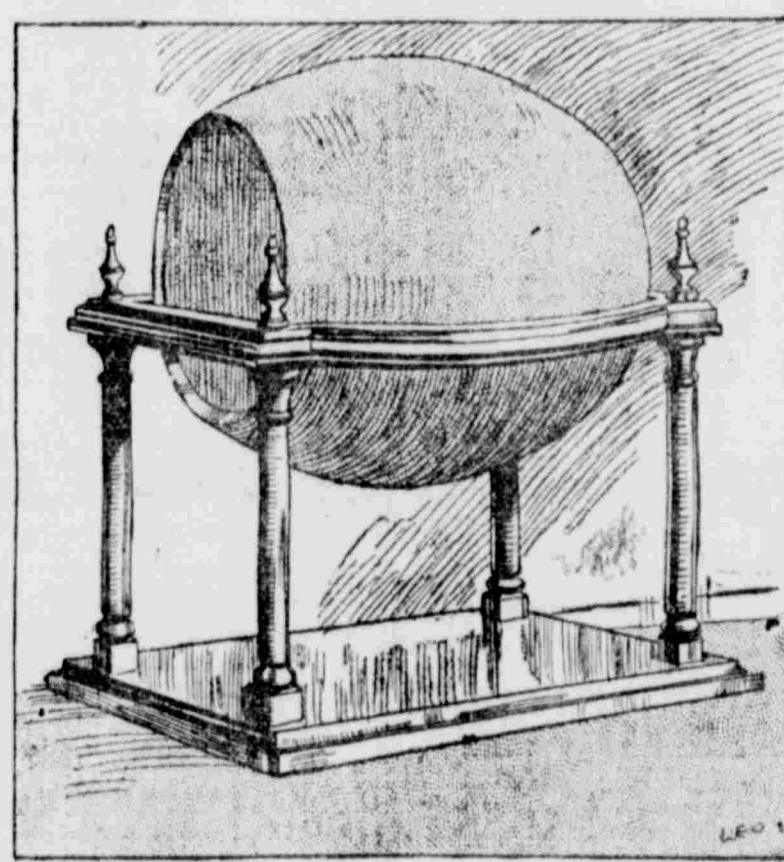
## THREE SPECIMENS OF AN UNKNOWN RACE.
