The next inquiry is how is this govern-

ment thus organized by the people to be

perpetuated? and how are its officers to

be chosen, and by whom? This is also pro-

vided for in the constitution.

Sec. I. Provides that all legislative powers

shall be vested in a congress of the United

States, which shall consist of a Senate and

House of Representatives.

Sec. II. Provides that the House of Repre-

sentatives shall be composed of members

chosen every second year, by the people, in

the several States.

Sec. III. Provides that the "Senate of the

United States shall be composed of two Sen-

ators from each State, chosen by the Legis-

lature thereof." Thus the House of Repre-

sentatives are chosen directly by the people,

and the Senate is chosen by the Legis-

lature of each State. The House of Repre-

sentatives is a representative

popular organization, and the Senate is

chosen by the Legislature of each State.

The whole legislative department, if

not strictly democratic, is at least repre-

sentative, and is designed to be perpetuated

by them as a living perpetual inheritance,
