The Hon, Gerald Legge, the first of the British Ruwenzori expedition to return to England after an absence of a year, has given a Router representative an interesting account of the work achieved up to the time he left.

Very satisfactory results have been obtained by the expedition, the oblect of which was to make a thorough ollection from the Ruwenzori range. Thirteen new mammais have been discovered, and peaks to the height of 16,300 feet have been ascended for the first time.

of 15,300 feet have been ascended for the first time. On arriving at Entebbe, 150 car-riers were engaged, but the march into the interior was slow owing to the transport of the collecting boxes and other impediments. A porter was swept away in crossing the Wini tiver, half way between Fort Portal and the Mubuku valley, but he was rescued. His hoat was lost. Arriving at a height of 7,600 feet, a permanent base camp was formed, and after a house had been built all the porters were sent home, only per-sonal boys and cooks being retained. The Wakonja people inhabiling the region were peaceful, and assisted the expedition in trapping specimens. They have many curious customs. On one occasion, when the expedition inquired the meaning of the continual inquired the meaning of the continual

Starting for the southeast in the direction of Lake Albert Edward, the explorers found many new birds, but few mammals, in July they proceeded westward for Congo territory, to work in which they had obtained permis-sion from Brussels. Owing to the tribes being in revolt, a Belsian of-ficer and 30 soldiers were attached to the party, and soon atterwards the officer and 10 of the soldiers had a light with natives, losing a sergean kithed and five men wounded-two fatally. The men had been attacked while marching through elephant grass 20 feet high.

The march to Fort Beni was per-formed to the accompaniment of the sound of war horns by the rebel tribes. There were stray shots from the enemy the day long, and poison-ed arrows were thrown from the bush. Two porters were hit. The advance suard killed some of the natives. During the excitement, just before reaching Beni, the advanced guard was charged by an elephant. Eight or 10 carriers were hit during the day. The party reached Fort Portal en Aug. 32, and from that point Mr. Legge marched continuously to En-tebbe, whence he traveled direct to England,-London Express.




