**Land Decision Reversed.**  
Secretary Schurz, to-day, reversed  
the decision of the Commissioner  
of the General Land Office in the  
case of George E. Buckman as the  
Central Pacific Railroad Co., in-  
volving the title to the tract of  
land in San Francisco district.  
Buckman has in the past been  
consistently held on the land since  
1863, and the Commissioner decided  
in his favor. It appears, however,  
that Buckman omitted to present  
his claim and the patent had been  
issued, that the recent decision of  
the supreme court in the case of  
Moore against Robbins, Sixth Otto,  
page 530, forbids the issue of an-  
other patent unless the Railroad Co.  
will release its claim and take those  
lands in lieu thereof, which the  
commissioner refused to do, and the

by his staff officers. General Ordo-  
ñez, commanding the department of Texas,  
and other american officers, and the  
citizens of Mexico and San Antonio  
welcomed the general and his military  
committee. A salute of artillery  
guns were fired. They spent to-  
day in visiting public buildings.

**WESTERN.**  
**A Conclusive Arrest.**  
SAN FRANCISCO, 31.—Wm. Bow-  
man was brought here from Sik-  
koy County, charged with counter-  
feiting. Considerable bogus coin  
was found in his possession.  
The other reports received to-  
day from all portions shows that  
the general rainfall was quite plen-  
tiful in the southern counties, but  
the north of the river the State

**BRITISH AMERICA.**  
**Critical Browning.**

**The Hanoverian Address of**  
**Loyalty.**  
The North German Gazette in-  
vestigates against the Danish court  
for giving an official reception to  
the Queen's departure, which re-  
sulted in the Hanoverian address of  
loyalty to the Duke of Cumberland,  
at his wedding with the Princess  
Alexandra. The Gazette says: "The  
Danish court has been guilty of a  
serious oversight, the bounds pre-  
scribed by the rules of international  
intercourse. Germany is surpris-  
ed to see Denmark favoring an an-  
tagonist of German tendency and dis-  
regarding the considerations which  
she is bound to observe in dealing  
with the German Empire."

**SPAIN.**  
**Interceding for Morocco.**  
MADRID, 31.—Monseñor (counsel  
and his wife and child were given  
an audience by King Alfonso, to-  
day. They have presented to the  
king a memorial, in which they re-  
quest for mercy, signed by 7,000 per-  
sons, including two bishops. Fur-  
thermore, Senora Sagasta and Cas-  
tejar have interceded with Senor  
Canovas, del Castillo in behalf of  
Morocco.

**RUSSIA.**  
**New Taxation Rat.**  
ST. PETERSBURG, 31.—The coun-  
cil of the empire approved the new  
rates of taxation proposed by the  
minister of finance, affecting  
stamps, liquors and cotton, other  
than Asiatic.

**TURKEY.**  
**A Definite Peace Treaty.**  
CONSTANTINOPLE, 31.—All Pa-  
sha, president of the council of  
state has been appointed second  
negotiator on behalf of Turkey for  
a definite treaty of peace with Rus-  
sia.
