

Letter number seven, written from Ujil, Dec. 18, 1871, is to Earl Granville. The writer says he was anxious to get home, but he was also anxious to make one more effort to finish his work. He then knew, pretty fairly, six hundred miles of the watershed of South Central Africa, and he says that from there "the vast number of the springs of the Nile do unquestionably arise." In the seventh hundred miles he had heard there were four fountains rising from the base of an earthern mound, each of which, at no great distance became a large river. He had sources that he could not doubt their ex-istence. He believed them to be the sources of the Nile, mentioned to Herodotics by the Secretary of Minerva in the city of Sais in Egypt.
