LONDON, July 5.—Mr. Spurgeon has experienced a sudden increase of his myalgia, and will remain at home for the present in a more dangerous condition. Constant prayer meetings will be held in the tabernacle today.

The "Waspets" Was on the Dry Rock.

VIRGINIA, B. C., July 5.—The flag ship "Waspets" arrived this morning, and will go on its dry dock for repairs. Report from Iquique state that the story of the bombardment is greatly exaggerated. Prayer Meeting for Electrocution.

NEW YORK, N. Y., July 5.—Prayer-meeting for the electric execution of the condemned criminals and all condemned, and the condemned, were held at the Tabernacle on Broadway this evening. BALTIMORE, July 5.—J. B. Lamb of Boston and W. J. Hagan and J. Waters of New York, who were killed by lightning in St. Mary's county, Maryland.

GRANADA, July 5.—A special to the Denver Times from Topeka, Kansas, says: The Rock Island passenger train was stopped last night, near Lyons Junction, Colorado, by grasshoppers. The insects devoured the food, and two engines were necessary to pull the train through, the crickets making the rails slippery. The engine was so bad in getting the train off, it ran five miles.

Englishman Arrested.

CHICAGO, July 5.—A bright child has been arrested in Chicago, to the extent of \$1,000,000. The property purchased is the Chicago Cold Storage Exchange Company's building on Dearborn street, and it is expected to sell the exchange place, and the projectors claim that when finished the storage of all kinds of perishable matter will be possible there.

W. B. Bixby of San Francisco negotiated the sale. He has just returned from London, where, after two months of work, he signed the deal. The purchase is the Londoner's and San Francisco Finance Corporation, limited. The deal will not affect the salesmen and the projectors will still preserve their interest.

Workers Go to Work.

SEATTLE, July 5.—The firm stand taken by the Seattle Coal and Iron company has resulted in going into liquidation, and most of the oil and gas to be sent to Oregon. About fifty more will go to work tomorrow. Coal Heiss has notified the company to resume business as soon as possible, and the officials are quite able to afford all the necessary protection to property. It was announced tonight that the oil and gas division was given the power to hire and discharge men, which is the main point of difference.

A Terrible Storm in Ireland.

GALWAY, July 5.—This city has been visited by most of the most terrible storms known to man. It is still raining and the writing is impossible to decipher. The damage is incalculable. The telegraph wires are broken along the coast. The water from the gulf is in the streets, and many were forced to abandon their belongings. Most of the houses are ruined. The telegraph wires are prostrated, practically cutting off all communication with the outside world.

The gales gradually subsided. During the day, however, the wind was driven in, blowing the lower portions of the city in the east end, along the gulf side. It descended into the city, and the waves beat against the houses. Two blocks of the old town, Western and East, were washed away, the street car tracks were car-

ried out and a portion of the breakwater protecting the beach hotel destroyed. The water of the gulf is still rolling inward and the gale is blowing about forty miles per hour. The electric light works and lights the city is wrapped in darkness, with the wind whistling and the rain falling in torrents.
