FORTY-FIFTH CONGRESS.

Credentials of New Senators Filed.

ALLEGED TEXAS OUTRAGES.

Thin Proceedings in Both the Houses.

By Telegram to the News.

Senate.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—The credentials of Senators Gray of Delaware, Dawes of Massachusetts and Gockrell of Missouri, for the Forty-fifth Congress, commencing March 4th next, were presented and placed on file.

Morgan, from the committee on foreign relations, made a report on the petition of William Webster, a citizen of the United States, with a resolution stating that after due examination of the matters presented in the petition, and of the evidence in support of the claim for indemnity from the United States, the committee recommended that the United States should not be bound by the claim of Great Britain, purchased by him in good faith from chiefs and duly conveyed to him by the Government of Texas, as to their being driven from their homes, compelled to abandon their property and deprived of the right of refuge in the United States.

The Senate refused consideration of the bill to establish agricultural experiment stations in connection with the Agricultural College, established under the act of July, 1883.

Mr. Morgan stated his objection to the bill to be that it did not

PLACE ANY CONTROL

over the subject within the power of the several States. He thought that the control of agricultural colleges and the proposed experiment stations should be placed entirely in the hands of the States. After a long discussion of the bill, the Senate adjourned.
