WASHINGTON, 29.—The commit-  
tee of additional clerks reported to the  
Senate during the month of April that  
there were 50 per cent of legal tender notes  
issued by the Secretary of the Treasury,  
leaving the amount of legal tender  
notes outstanding \$346,681,312. The  
total amount of additional circulation  
issued since January 14, 1875, to date \$44,  
155,000, amount of national bank  
notes outstanding to date \$22,655,000.

CONGRESSIONAL.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 29.—Conkling, in  
behalf of the judiciary committee  
submitted a unanimous report in  
response to the recent resolution  
directing the committee to inquire  
what was done by the New York  
legislature in relation to the  
abolition of slavery in the state, and  
whether any organization of  
said legislature exists or is pur-  
posed not authorized. The report  
states that the United States title  
to the property was acquired from  
New York by the New York legis-  
lature, and that the premises should be  
used for legislative purposes, and  
not for other purposes. To devote a  
part of the premises to uses having  
no relation to the objects denoted,  
would be a violation of the terms  
and spirit of the transaction.
