SALT LAKE CITY. March 17, 1896.

Last Friday afternoon we made a clean up of the three millions of white fish fry by planting the last of them iu Lake at Fish Haven, 80me Bear twenty-seven miles from Montpeller, where they were hatched out on the U.S. Fish Car No. 3. We reached Mentpelier on Sunday morning, the Sth inst., and on the day following, the process of batching commenced and continued day and night until all were out of the eggs, and put into the swim in most excellent condition, the temperature of the water registering 38 The try were conveyed ueg. F. heat. from the car in fish cans filled with ice cold water, to Fish Haven in sleight, two teams being emplayed to dn the work, making in all the work. making men in ne. The captain and men in eight trips. charge of the car and consignment believe that Bear Lake is in every respect suited to the Lature and Leeds of the

Utsh, Idabo and Wyoming, whose people will be the direct beneficiaries of this and lormer magnificent fry plants in Bear lake and Bear river, are due to the general government and to the U. P. and Chicago and North-Western Railway companies for free transportation of car and crew. The rallway officials at Pocatelloand Montuelter rendered us very helpful and valuable service in consummati. g our labore, the truitages of which we ex-pect and hope will be of incalculable value to the people of all this inter-mountain region, not merely for a decade of a century, but for ages to come, i.e., if they multiply as they do elsewhere, and are by law protected.

I have beard from many sources that the shad planted in 1871, in the north end of the lake have been seen by many persons at different times and sundry places. One was caught measuring a foot in length, From what I nave heard coucerning them, I feel coufident they are already abundant, and that within a few years they will ue found for sale in our marts, at a cost to the consumer below the present price asked for the imported article.
