SALVADOR MAKES PRETTY NEARLY EV-ERYTHING OUT OF THE FIBERS OF THE TREE. the Church would not have his instructions long, and the world would not be troubled with him a great while, A roung Salvadorlan, with the dark eyes and inky hair of his country, taiked to a reporter the other day about the Central America banana tree. The tree is two and a haif to three feet in cir-cumference at its base. Its tapering fibrous body, without a branch, is from ten to fifteen feet in heighf. The fibers, separated by a thin pith, are as long as the body of the tree. These fibers are used in Salvz.'or, just as they are taken from the tree, as shoe-strings and as cords for all purposes. The natives use them largely for bridle reins and lariats. The raw material costs only transportation to the rope-walks. and would not have his teachings.
