Wired from Washington.

The report of the Fourth Auditor of the Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30th last, shows the total expenditures on account of the Navy to have been \$17,145,000, and also that there was expended \$23,750 in excess of the appropriation. There was an unexpended balance of \$82,750 on certain appropriations. The amount paid to Navy pensioners during the year was \$1,000,000.

According to the report of the Register of the Treasury, of the \$1,071,401,202 of the United States registered bonds only \$11,577,000 are held abroad. The Register recommends the creation of a building for the permanent preservation of the records of the Treasury, stating that the vaults now used are in a bad condition.

In his annual report to the Secretary of the Interior, the Commissioner of the General Land Office, said the exterior marble walls of the buildings are now requiring their attention. The Commissioner also said that the buildings have been put in repair, and the interior of the buildings is in a good condition. Various recommendations as to electric lighting and other minor matters have been made.

The Treasury Department to-day purchased 20,000 ounces of silver for delivery at the Philadelphia and New Orleans Mint.

The Secretary of the Treasury has directed the Customs officers to cooperate with the Chief of the Bureau of Customs in the collection of duties on foreign commerce.

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From these it is learned that on the 11th the vessel, which was laden with 100 cases of kerosene, when about 120 miles from Tananarive, Island, near Van Diemen's Straits, encountered a severe typhoon and was wrecked on the 13th. Seven of the fifteen men comprising the crew succeeded in launching the only boat left, and without water, food or clothing, cast themselves adrift. Finally they reached Tananarive, Island, when they were conveyed to the hospital.

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A Great Strike by the Knights of Labor.
GALVESTON, 3.—A strike of considerable magnitude was inaugurated to-day afternoon by the Knights of Labor. The trouble arose from the refusal of the Malloy line to employ colored men to withdraw the colored "longshoremen" from the Malloy wharf, where they had been working since the past week, replacing the striking longshoremen. The strikers joined the colored men in their refusal to work, and the Malloy line has been forced to stop work.
