The *Tribune's* special says Senator Sherman intends to introduce a bill converting the maturing debt into a long consolidated loan, of not less than thirty years, at six per cent., with one per cent. tax, equivalent to five per cent loan.

Late dispatches from Athens state that since the failure of the Turco-Cretan mission hostilities have been resumed in Candia.

It is thought the sentences of most of the Fenians recently convicted by the Special Commission will be commuted to hard labor for a term of years. Allen, whose offense was the worst presented of any of the criminals, will probably be executed on November 23.

The Conference proposed by Napoleon for the settlement of the Roman question, seems to be attended with difficulties. The Pope objects to any Conference whatever. Several of the powers which have been invited to participate are divided on the question of the necessity for such a Conference. It is asserted that Spain is the only power which supports the temporal power of the Pope in any event.

The United States is to pay eleven and a half millions for the Islands of St. Thomas and Santa Cruz, subject to the claims of France on the latter; or seven and a half millions for the former.

There was a meteoric shower on the night of the 13th, which was very brilliant, many thousands being visible.

Warren and Halpin are sentenced to 15 years' imprisonment, and Costello to 12 years.

Weston, the pedestrian, started at 10¹/₂ last night, on his 3rd trial to walk 100 miles in 24 hours. He made the first fifty miles in ten hours and five minutes. Upon his arrival at Conneaut, Ohio, a little after 8, his feet were so badly swollen that he abandoned the attempt. The excitement over Weston's walk is very great throughout the country; he meets immense popular demonstrations everywhere.

There was a large fire last night which caused a loss of \$100,000.

A freight train at Ogdensburg, on the Champlain R.R., was thrown off the track to-day. The engine and five cars are down the embankment. The brakeman was killed.

The boiler of a freight engine exploded in this city this morning, tearing the engine to fragments, and instantly killing the engineer and fireman, both of whose heads were torn off horribly.

Seymour Voulair, a prominent criminal lawyer of this city, was shot last night by Isaac Ruth, clerk of the post office. Ruth was returning from the theatre with Voulair's divorced wife, when Voulair met them and fired at Ruth. Ruth returned the fire, shooting Voulair in the right breast, who now lies in a critical condition. The affair caused much excitement as the parties occupy highly respectable situations.

A kerosene lamp exploded in the midst of a large party at General Sibley's house, resulting in the death of a servant girl, and serious injury to Miss Sibley.

The official vote of Georgia is 102,000 for the Convention, 4,000 against it. 3,600 whites voted for the Convention.

The Reconstruction Convention adopted a resolution to change the name of the company created by the last legislature. The committee reported an ordinance that the officers of the Executive Department consist of a Governor, Lieut. Governor, Auditor, Secretary of the Treasury; the Auditor to hold office for 4 years, and the others for 2 years; all to be elected by the people. Heretofore the Governor was elected by the popular vote.

The French troops are preparing to go into winter quarters at Civita Vecchia. General Dannes is appointed to succeed Marshal McMahon as Governor General of Algeria.

The Fenian prisoners Halpin, Warren and Costello, on being asked if they had anything to say against the pronouncement of their sentence after a trial without a mixed jury, claimed American citizenship.

The Treasury Department decides that unless the holders of seven-thirties present them for conversion into five-twenties at maturity, they will be paid greenbacks.

Advices from Vera Cruz announce the arrival of Romero. All the members of the court martial which tried Santa Anna, except Provicutori, have been imprisoned in the fortress of San Juan, for the mildness of the sentence. Juarez has commuted the sentences of the Imperialist generals and colonels, native and foreign, to four years imprisonment; field staff officers to three years; line officers to two years; other foreign adherents of the empire are sentenced to banishment.

The freight train on the Erie railroad ran into an oil train at Calicoone station. Twenty oil cans and one locomotive are burned. The loss is very heavy.

The propeller Antelope, with a valuable cargo, was burned in the dock to-day. Loss \$150,000.

Two entire blocks of the business portion of the town were burned on Friday night. Loss \$210,000.

A dispatch from Fort Harker states that 2 men were murdered by Indians last week near Fort Dodge. The Indians are supposed to be northern Cheyennes.

Official returns from forty-eight counties have reported Democratic majorities in New York: King's County Democratic majority is 50,283.
