As the commission draws \$65,000 a year, it will cost the United States at least \$4,000 each to supervise the election of twenty-five men, the salary of twenty-four of whom—the members of the legislature—is only \$240 each, and that but once in two years. Is this Mr. Tucker's fdea of retrenchment?"
