"P.—Persons changing residence from Ogden to another place will have to show that their names will be transferred to the list of the preceding year, before October 1st, so that the date fixed by law when the registrar has to turn over to the auditor the lists of the state and registration lists is to be October 1st.

"Second—Persons entitled to registration who may have been advised by the deputies in their house-hold census, can now call at their

office, room 513, City Loan and Trust Building and be registered.

Fourth—it is not necessary for a person to pay any taxes before he receives his tax bills, which automatically will be forwarded during the six days allotted for closing the census."
