### AN ORDINANCE

In relation to Assessing and Collecting Local Taxes.

SEC. 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of Great Salt Lake City; That a sufficient tax may be levied and collected on real estate or land claims and improvements thereon, in any division benefitted thereby, within the limits of said city; to defray the expense of leveling, paving, macadamizing or planking and opening and keeping in repair the Streets and Side-walks; of constructing sewers, drains, ditches and reservoirs and keeping the same in repair; of making and keeping in repair bridges; and of erecting lamps and lighting the streets in such respective districts or divisions; *Provided*, the money thus raised shall be exclusively expended for such purpose in the district where such taxes are assessed and by such person or persons as the City Council may appoint.

SEC. 2. Whenever the City Council shall deem it necessary to make any such improvement, the City Recorder shall give public notice to the property holders of said district or division by posting up, not less than three notices in the same, or by publication in some newspaper in said city, calling a meeting setting forth the time and place thereof, at which meeting a decision shall be made by a two-third vote of said property holders present of the nature and extent of said improvement and the amount to be assessed for the same, shall be determined by the City Council.

SEC. 3. Three Commissioners shall be appointed by the City Council to make the assessment; who before entering upon the duties of their office, shall take and subscribe an oath for the faithful and impartial discharge of their respective duties. It shall be the duty of said Commissioners to make the assessment on the real estate or land claims and improvements by them deemed benefitted thereby, in proportion to the benefits resulting therefrom; and may require persons to give a statement under oath of the amount of their taxable property. After making the assessment, the Commissioners shall deliver a correct copy of the same to the City Recorder within ten days after their appointment duly signed by each of them.

SEC. 4. The City Recorder shall cause a notice to be published to those interested of the completion of the assessment and the time and place shall be designated therein, when the City Council shall hear appeals and objections and correct or confirm said assessment. The City Recorder shall within ten days thereafter, make a correct tax list which shall be delivered to the Collector, or any authorized agent appointed by the City Council; who before entering upon his duties shall take and subscribe an oath and execute bonds with securities approved of and filed with the said Recorder. He shall collect said taxes and pay the same to the City Treasurer within such time as may be required by said Council.

SEC. 5. The Agent or Collector on receiving the tax-list for collection shall furnish to each tax-payer or leave at their usual place of residence a notice of the amount of tax due from them, and any person neglecting to pay his or her tax within twenty days thereafter, it shall be deemed a refusal. If any person refuses to pay his or her tax when required, the Agent or Collector is hereby authorized and empowered to take and sell, in manner most advantageous for the owner, enough taxable property belonging to the delinquent to pay his or her taxes with costs of collection; and if said property is to be sold at public sale, he shall not give less than ten days' notice of the time, place and kind of property.

SEC. 6. If any assessment is set aside by order of any court, the City Council may cause a new one to be made for the same purpose for the collection of the amount so assessed. If the first assessment prove insufficient, authority may be made in the same manner; or, if too large a sum shall at any time be raised, the excess shall be refunded rateably to those by whom it was paid.

SEC. 7. All taxes and assessments levied or assessed under this ordinance shall be a lien upon the property upon which the same may be imposed, voted or assessed, for two years from and after the correction of the assessment list shall have been confirmed, and no sale or transfer shall affect the lien.

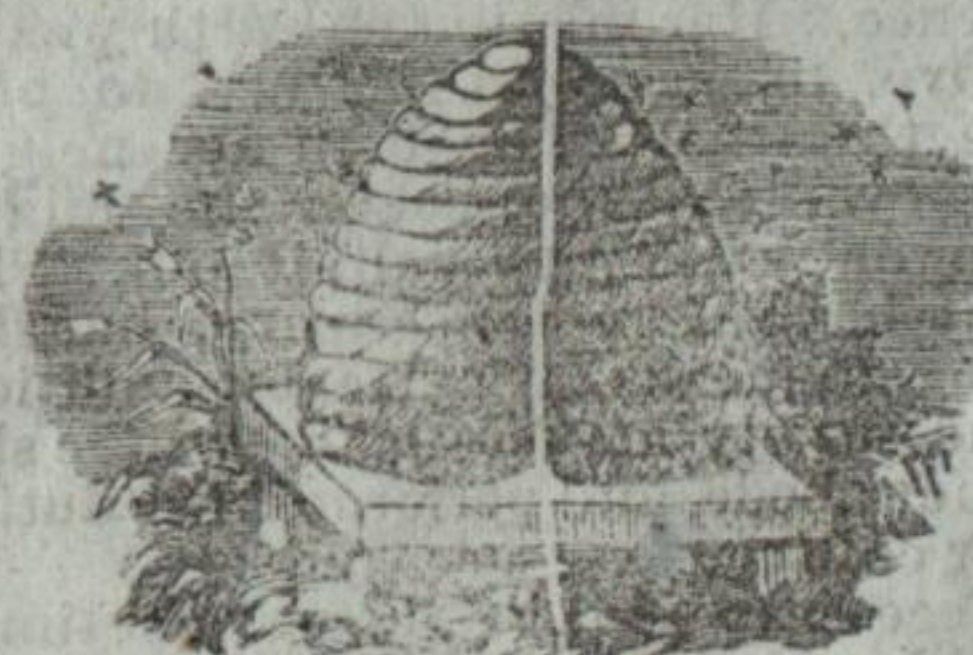
