The Idaho Register, published at Eagle Rock, has the following communication in its issue of Saturday last: Editor Register:—It was reported to me last Saturday by William Robson, of Medicine Lodge, that an Indian had found a dead man. It at once procured the services of Julius Bassett and team and started for Medicine Lodge the same evening. The next morning we found the Indian camp; the buck was out hunting who gave the information, but his squaw came with us to a point on Beaver Cañon Creek, one mile north of High Bridge station, where he found the skeleton of a man. The head was about two rods from where the coat, pants and balance were found. The flesh had all disappeared. His upper and lower jaw showed a good set of teeth. He must have been dead a year or more. One foot was gone, the other showed a No. 6 or 7 shoe, laced half way up the balance patent hooks, double sole, not much the worse for wear. He seemed to be well clad, blue dumper next to his shirt, over that a dark woolen knitted jacket, with collar turned out, dark twilled pants with

gold thread, dark grey coat with stripes an inch wide. We brought the remains to Beaver Cañon, where an inquest was held. The jury returned a verdict that deceased, name unknown, came to his death by causes unknown to them. Parties desiring any further information can correspond with me. J. BURNSIDE.
