Licensed Makers Preparing Fine Group for Garden Show.

Many motoring eyes are now turned toward the 1968 e-cylinder models. About this time last year motorists heard that 1997 was to be the "big six" year, but in reality the 6-cylinder was only started. This year it has been developed to a state of refinement.
