EASTERN.
The Fast Mail Railway Service.

New York, 25.—With the trains of yesterday morning ended the brief existence of the fast mail railway service, and its demise, as well as its birth, was made a celebration by the postal clerks, not on account of any dislike of the employment, but from the feeling that such an important work should be duly noticed. As the train left the Grand Central depot its course was marked for a considerable distance by the display of fire crackers and the display of roman candles and colored lights. The trains on both routes—the New York Central and Pennsylvania Railroad—were delayed about the average amount of mail matter, the former about twenty-five tons and the latter about fifteen tons. It is impossible to present time to state what arrangement will be made with the Post Office authorities for the prompt carriage of the mail. The arrangement will have to be made with new trains, will take a large amount of work. The change in one schedule necessitates another and this in turn necessitates inquiry and delay before it can be made. Proper arrangements, however, have been made covering the next two days, and early in the week it is hoped to have every thing in good running order.
