Mail advices from Apple, Idaho, under date of May 23 give the following information: There is no movement in the war zone here. Notwithstanding the presence of three ships of war, there is every prospect of serious and bloody fighting at an early date...

The J. and K. rebel contingent, summoned to promenade in the parade, refused their guns to the government. They, however, refused to fulfill other promises made by them, and announced their intention of joining the Army party of rebels.

The question of war or no war with Asia was in abeyance until word was spilled on Thursday last. There was evidently a strong feeling among those in authority that terms could be arranged without resorting to military force. Asia has assumed an exceedingly defiant attitude, and in turning

out the government soldiers from their district have been persistently active, so much so, indeed, that in many cases even the women have been deprived of their clothing.

The German war ship Rurik arrived at Salt Lake on May 12th. There are now two German war ships here, and many rumors are afloat as to what their intentions are. The British ship Curlew is also in the harbor.
