lic companies and emigration laws. In July, 1877, the Marquis adver-tised and for sale in the Island of Port Breton, Oceanica, and inaugu-rated a scheme for the emigration of Legitimists. The papers interests i themselves in the enterprise, and 5,000,000 frames were subscribed. Of this sum the Marquis pocketed 2,000,000. It is stated that 700,000 hectares of land were sold, although the island only contains 7,000 hec-tares. The Marquis had maps of the land published, in which there was indicated imaginary houses, churches and roads.
