the Penitentiary, A brush factory is being established at the penitentiary by Warden Dow. The new project is to teach the con-victs in a vocation that will be bene-ficial to them, after they are dis-charged, and also to keep them occu-

charged, and also to keep them occu-pied. Machinery has been ordered and although the factory will have to be run by hand at present, Warden Dow expresses the hope that the next Legis-lature will appropriate a sufficient amount to purchase an engine, that the factory might be run by steam. The convicts will be instructed in this new externation by W. White an error of enterprise by Mr. White, an expert at the business.

There are shoe and clothing factories now at the prison, which supply the State insane asylum, also a sack factory and a saddle cinch factory. Out of the 175 convicts, all but about 10 per cent are employed about the prison.

SHEARING SHEEP BY MACHINERY

Inquiries continue to come concerning the use of the clippers in shearing sheep by machinery. We have repeat-edly submitted information on this sub-ject by text and by illustration. Handject by text and by illustration. Hand-shearing of large flocks will soon be a thing of the past. The economy in time and labor and the increased amount of wool secured by use of the power clippers have settled the ques-tion in its commercial aspect. Some difficulty has been encountered in the perfection of the hand-power shearing machines, but that has been almost if not entirely overcome by recent im-provements. We do not mean to imply that these hand-power clippers have been endowed with brains. The oper-ator must supply the intelligence, just as with any other piece of machinery. as with any other piece of machinery. It seems now to be merely a matter of It seems how to be morely a matter of adjustment of the clippers and when that has been mastered by the operator the work of the machine is highly sat-isfactory. Implement makers have just cause of complaint at many farmers who refuse to follow directions in the operation of machines; they think they know more about them than the in-ventors and the makers. In using the shear shearing machines the instrucsheep-shearing machines the instruc-tions furnished by the makers should be faithfully followed and satisfaction may be expected.—Breeders' Gazette.
