

LATEST BY TELEGRAPH

BOSTON, 13.—A large fire has been raging several hours in the business portion of Natick, Mass.; already the loss is half a million.

The fire in Natick is under control; nearly the whole business portion of the village is destroyed, three stores only being saved. The loss is estimated at \$500,000.

NEW YORK, 13.—This morning a fire occurred in a brick building at 25 E 60th Street, and the flames spread rapidly. It being known that a number of persons were in the house on the second and third stories, alarms were sent out, and in a short time a large number of firemen were on the spot.

At eleven this forenoon about five thousand persons had assembled in Tompkins Square. The police received orders to drive them out, and while doing it Sergeant Bergbold was assaulted by one Myer.

FOREIGN.

MADRID, 13.—Cartagena has surrendered, and is now occupied by the government troops under General Dominquez. Upon the capitulation of the city, the Intransigent Junta and liberated convicts went on board the frigate Numancia, which was attacked by the government squadron, and at the time the last dispatch was forwarded a naval engagement was in progress.
