County Clerk Stanton Arrested on Complaint of E. W. Wilson

FOR FAILING TO ISSUE CERTIFICATE

Sgt. Miller Allowed to File a Cross-Complaint—Divergents Set Aside—Other Business.

County Clerk C. E. Stanton was arrested this morning upon a complaint filed in Justice Belmont's court by E. W. Wilson, representative-elect from this district. The proceedings are under the criminal code, the complaint charging that Mr. Stanton wilfully neglected and refused to perform his duty as clerk of this county in failing to issue to the plaintiff his certificate of election when so requested by the complainant this morning.

Mr. Stanton appeared before Justice Belmont this afternoon and made several in which he says the certificates of election are being gotten out as fast as possible and that Mr. Wilson's document was not yet ready.

Now the election ball has opened and the next thing will be "pay the bill."

DEATH OF A PIONEER.

One of the Original Company Passes From This Life.

George Pierce Miller, of Mantua, Makes the Journey to the Great Beyond—His Honorable Career.

MARTL, Dec. 5.—George Pierce Miller, one of the pioneers of Utah, died at his residence in this city at 8:30 a.m. yesterday, Dec. 2, in his seventieth year. He was born in Ohio on July 25, 1827, and was one of a family of nine children. His father was Elias Miller, one of the first members of the Church, and the son lived and died a true Latter-day Saint. His name stands above the plates a mere legend, as one of the founders of the first company of 147 and lived in Salt Lake City for 10 years, and in gold excitement went out to California, where he died in 1852. After a few years he returned to Utah and resided in Sanpete county where he married Judith Patten who died in 1866. In a few years he moved to Jensen, Sanpete, where he had eight children. Of the seventeen children, thirteen are living in Utah near the family residence.
