## CONCERNING SUPERVISORS OF ELECTION.

SECTION 2011 of the United States Revised Statutes says-

"Whenever, in any city or town having upward of twenty thousand inhabitants, there are two citizens thereof, or whenever, in any county r parish in any congressional dislet, there are ten citizens thereof, of good standing, who, prior to any registration of voters for an election for Representative or Delegate in the Congress of the United States, or prior to any election at which a band and father. Representative or Delegate in Congress is to be voted for, may make known, in writing, to the judge of the circuit court of the United States for the circuit wherein such city or town, county or parish, is situated, their desire to have such shares. registration or such election, or both, guarded and scrutinized, the judge, within not less than ten lays prior to the registration, if one there be, or, if no registration be required, within not less than ten days prior to the election, shall

After the dam was constructed across the Jordan River, which raised the water at said dam 10 feet, I, by your request, on the 11th day of June, 1872, took the difference o Section 2025 provides for the ap-pointment of a chief supervisor of elections in each judicial district of a circuit, and sections 2020 and 2020 describe his duties. Section 2020 restricts the duties level between the surface of the difference at the present time of 34 feet between the outlet of the Lake and the dam. Provo and found the Lake 1610 feet higher than when the bench was first established. We also determined that the high water mark of 1862 was 1 6-10 feet higher than the high water mark of 1876.

On October 20th, 1876, we again tested our benches at Lehi and found the river at the bridge 4-10 of a foot higher, and at the outlet
