He implicated Oldham, who, just a month after the robbery of the stage, Oldham was found guilty.

Charles W. Williams, of San Francisco, has received instructions from Commissioner Miller relative to the distribution of the money appropriated by Congress for the relief of sugar planters who were affected by the amount of the bounty in the McKinley Tariff. It is estimated that \$1,000,000 will be distributed to the three best sugar manufacturers in California—the Alameda, the Western Beet Refinery, and the China. Last year of the \$10,000,000 distributed by the government, the sugar industry received \$1,000,000 paid to California, as follows: To the Western Beet Sugar Refinery \$200,000, to the China \$200,000 and to the Alameda \$100,000, the average yield being 200 pounds per acre. The amount of the sugar bounty thus allowed must make application to the commissioner of internal revenue. After proper examination and verification the bounty will be paid to the treasury.

There are no sugar-refining plants in the United States. Those outside of California, which have the most, are in Virginia, Utah and Nevada. The California yield is far greater than that in the other states.

Mc. C. J. Hart's residence, a large two-story structure occupying nearly two acres of ground, Cal., was destroyed by fire Monday morning. The house was temporarily occupied by seven gentlemen, a lady and a little girl eight years old. For some reason the lady had gone out, and it is supposed that the lamp exploded or was carelessly left burning. The others were the two men, Mr. Campbell and Mr. Smith. The latter was awakened by the smoke and jumping out of bed, ran out to awaken Campbell, who had also slept. They took some clothing and started down stairs, and the flames blocked their passage. A fatal accident occurred Monday at the residence of Smith's, last two miles from Salt Lake City. A Separatist, who resided with the master, Wm. Costa and Costa's son, got into two blasts at the bottom of the stairs, the hundred and sixty feet deep. One of the blasts failed to explode, but after waiting twenty-five minutes, was followed with a new fuse and primer to it all. Costa remained in the bottom to attend to the signals while Costa blew the blast. As soon as Costa had blown the blast, Costa was ready to leave, but Costa's son told Costa to leave him alone and return to the room. Costa then went to the top of the stairs, took a signal from the boy, laid the drift, and almost immediately theractered the blast exploded. Costa was found in the basket with his head crushed and his left side almost torn to pieces. Costa escaped injury.
