The had a fire burning, and before they could be rescued were all burned to death. Their bodies have not yet been taken out as the store is still burning. It is impossible, at present, to ascertain the amount of Mr. Strick-ley's loss. Another slide came down taking the Vallejo boarding house, and other casualties are reported, but as yet their names cannot be ascer-tained.

LATION TO THE SALT LAKE CITY WATER WORKS AND THE SUPPLY OF WATER FROM THE MODELS AND FOR OTHER PURCESS, PASS-ED JULY 31ST, 1877.

Show i. - Be it Contained and City Council of Stat Lake City: That Section Twenty five of "An Ordi-nance in relation to the Sait Lake City Water Works and the supply of water from the main pipes and for other purposes," passed Jusy 31, 1877, be and the same is hereby amended by adding by the and of said section the following: "To run a motor or inchine of any

"To run a motor or durbine of any description, not exceeding one horse power, fifty dollars; and for each ad, ditional horse power or fractional part thereof, forty dollars. "To run hydraulic engines for elevators, for each elevator, three hundred dollars; *Provided* that on proclamation of the Mayor to that effect, no such motor, turbine or hydraulic engine shall be supplied with water from the Salt Lake City Water Works during the months of July, August or Septem-ber in each year, any license thereber in each year, any license there-for notwithstanding. Any person applying for a license to run a motor, turbine or hydraulic engine, may be
