The President to be Arraigned in the Senate on Monday.

STEWART CREATES A SENSATION.

The Chief Executive Assured of Victory in the Constitution of the United States.**Washington, D. C., Sept. 23.—The President of the United States will be arraigned in the United States Senate on Monday for violating the spirit of the Constitution, in endeavoring to sustain the independence of the government, by sending his Congress into the recess of the final vote.****A motion to adjourn the House of Representatives was introduced in a committee of the whole on Monday afternoon, and was voted down.
