

Patriarchate of Constantinople. In 1686 the Patriarch of Antioch returned to the Roman obedience, and since then the patriarchates of Alexandria and Jerusalem have also submitted. The Melchite prelate is elected by the bishops, under the supervision of the Propaganda of Rome, and then must be confirmed by the Pope. The Melchite clergy are married, that is if married before receiving orders, they can still remain so.

The Greek Catholics of Italy number about 80,000. Their clergy when in minor orders are allowed to marry, and to continue in the married state after they are priests, but are forbidden, under pain of deposition, to contract a second marriage.

The Greco-Roman Catholics number about 900,000. They form an ecclesiastical province, in Austria and Hungary. Their clergy are also married.

In the United States the Russian orthodox church has a total of twelve organizations, twenty-three edifices, value of property \$220,000 and a membership of 13,504. The chief governing body of the church is the holy synod of St. Petersburg. The difference between this and the Roman in doctrine is very slight. The Russian maintains that the Holy Ghost sprang from the Father alone, while the Western or Roman believes he sprang from Father and Son both.

The Greek orthodox church has in the United States one organization, one edifice, and 100 members. This is the national church of Greece. It is the same in faith as the orthodox church of Russia.

The Armenian church in this country has six organizations and 385 communicants. It has no edifices of its own, but meets for worship in the chapels of the Protestant Episcopal Church. This is separate from both Latin and Greek churches, and conducts its services in Armenian.

The Old Catholic Church has in this country four organizations, three edifices, value of property \$13,320 and a membership of 665. This holds that the Pope is merely a bishop. Whether this sect had its origin with Dollinger who voted against infallibility in 1870 is not clear.

The Reformed Catholic Church has a membership of 1,000, with eight organizations. This was started about ten years ago by Irish priests who were cut off from the Roman Church for interfering in Irish politics, and for advocating separation between England and Ireland. It repudiates papal authority, but adheres to the Latin system of worship.

Some person put dynamite in the Methodist Episcopal church bell at Breckenridge, Col., on the 17th inst. and the bell and belfry were blown to atoms, endangering the lives of more than 100 people. The deed is supposed to have been caused by the ill-feeling engendered against the Rev. Mr. Pass more because he wanted the saloons closed on Sunday.

THE CANVASS.

Messrs. Elijah Sells, C. P. Mason, R. W. Young, S. J. Kenyon and Judge Boreman, who comprise the committee appointed by the Utah Commission to canvass the returns of the recent election, so far as they relate to county and precinct officers, met at the headquarters of the Commission yesterday and completed the county of Beaver, Box Elder and Cache counties, and a portion of Davis.

Owing to some question in regard to the sheets of Beaver county, they were held in abeyance for the time being.

The difficulty in respect to Beaver county was occasioned by the fact that officers had been voted for that should have been appointed by the county court.

The Utah Commission began the canvass of the legislative vote today, and finished Beaver county before going to lunch. The count will be made by counties, and not by legislative districts, and the counties will be taken in alphabetical order. Hence it will be some days before the legislative

vote can be compiled and published in tabulated form.
